

Boğaziçi University opens its culturally significant buildings and natural heritage sites to visitors as part of public events. By offering free and by appointment access to these sites, the university aims to encourage local communities and visitors to interact with cultural heritage.

Boğaziçi University Promotional Activities

Within the scope of the "Boğaziçi University Introduction Days ' programme, which is organised every year for prospective students who will make university choices, prospective students and their families have the opportunity to visit the campus, meet the faculty members, get information about the undergraduate programmes offered by the departments and take a campus tour. In addition, secondary education institutions can make a special application during the semester and organise visits that enable their students to get to know the academic and social opportunities of Boğaziçi University.

Historical and Architectural Richness of South Campus

The foundations of Boğaziçi University were laid with the establishment of Robert College in **1863**, and the South Campus stands out with its architecture of historical and cultural significance. All historical buildings on the South Campus were built before the First World War and were constructed using blue limestone quarried from the quarry located on the campus. Hamlin Hall, the first building of Robert College, was completed in 1871. It was followed by Kennedy Lodge, which was built as the president's house in 1891, Albert Long Hall, which was completed in 1892, Theodorus Hall, which served as a preparatory building in 1902, Dodge Gymnasium, which opened as a gymnasium in 1904, Washburn Hall in 1906, Anderson Hall in 1913 and Sloane Hall, which was used as a dispensary in 1914. These buildings are among the important artefacts that symbolise the historical depth and unique cultural heritage of Boğaziçi University. The historic Albert Long Hall is open to the public throughout the year, hosting events such as concerts and conferences.

Nazım Hikmet Culture and Art Research Centre

Nazım Hikmet Culture and Art Research Centre is another important building contributing to the cultural heritage of the university. The Centre aims to perpetuate the memory of Nâzım Hikmet, one of the most influential, talented and world-renowned poets of recent times, by creating an extensive archive and researching his widespread influence on Turkish literature and national culture and arts policies. Hosting panels, seminars, workshops and public cultural events in the historical buildings of Boğaziçi University, this centre allows visitors to interact with the rich cultural heritage of the university.

Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute

Kandilli Campus carries the legacy of the Kandilli Observatory, which was established in 1868 and affiliated to Boğaziçi University in 1982 and renamed Boğaziçi University Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute (KRDAE). Kandilli Observatory was established in 1868 as Rasathane-i Amire at the suggestion of the French government to transmit weather forecasts to certain centres by telegraph. The Observatory, which first started its operations on a 74-metre high hill in Pera, was later moved to a telegraph office opposite the Artillery School in Maçka. However, during the 31 March Incident of 1909, the Observatory in Maçka was destroyed. Following this incident, the Observatory started to operate at its present location on İcadiye Hill in Vaniköy in 1911. In 1936, the name of the institution was changed to Kandilli Astronomy and Geophysics Observatory, and in 1982, it was affiliated to Boğaziçi University and started to carry out scientific research and education activities under the name of Boğaziçi University Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute.

History of Observatory Science

The Observatory Science History Collection is exhibited in the historical Seismological Building, the foundation of which was laid in 1930 and the construction of which was completed in 1934. Various scientific instruments used by the Observatory in the fields of astronomy and earth sciences are exhibited in the building. In this building, samples of Kandilli manuscripts related to astronomy, astrology, mathematics and geography in the Observatory Archive are also exhibited.

This collection consists of observation instruments invented by Turkish scientists in the Ottoman period, books and calendars on astronomy, seismographs and various astronomy, geodesy, magnetics, meteorology and time instruments, most of which were imported from Europe and the United States, which were used in the Observatory - i Amire established in 1868 and used after the observatory was moved to Kandilli in 1911.

Scientific instruments include:

Sextants, octants, telescopes, theodolites, pantographs, artificial horizons, barometers, clocks, sundials, thermographs, observation record reports, maps, calendars, large seismographs which are earthquake recording instruments, maritime clocks, measuring and calculating machines, auxiliary instruments for determining time, rubu boards, astrolabes, earth globes, celestial globes, solar system, meridian telescopes, qiblenumas.

Observatory Excursion

Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute accepts groups of visitors from primary, secondary and high schools by appointment system. The 80-minute excursion programme, which is free of charge for groups of up to 30 people, covers three main parts:

Disaster Preparedness and Earthquake Park Visit: Participants are given basic disaster awareness training in line with pedagogical data and practical applications are made in Deprempark.

Astronomy Laboratory: Visitors have the opportunity to learn about general astronomy and solar observations.

Meteorology Laboratory: Basic information about meteorology is shared, meteorological measuring instruments are introduced and weather forecasting processes are explained.

This rich-content programme provides the participants with both theoretical and practical knowledge and scientific awareness, as well as the opportunity to see the campus and buildings. In addition, ABCD Basic Disaster Awareness Training is given open to the public at the Disaster Preparedness Laboratory (AHLAB) as part of the 'Public Day' events organised every Tuesday. For individual visitors, the Astronomy Laboratory provides information about laboratory work and astronomy-related topics of interest, as well as hosting events for popular astronomical events such as eclipses and planetary transits.



Interlibrary Loan Service (ILL)

Interlibrary Loan Service (ILL) allows libraries to obtain resources from other libraries that are not in their own collections. Established as an academic unit of Boğaziçi University, the Nâzım Hikmet Culture and Art Research Centre acquired almost all published works of Nâzım Hikmet, except for a few first editions and rare foreign editions, all articles on Nâzım Hikmet, and all books on Nâzım Hikmet published in Turkish in 2017. Researchers can work in the library by appointment.

Boğaziçi University provides free public access to museums, exhibition spaces and artworks. Through this access, the University aims to bring the community together with art, culture and history.


Boğaziçi University Cultural Heritage Museum

Located on the South Campus of Boğaziçi University, the Cultural Heritage Museum is a rare place that sheds light on the rich history and cultural heritage of the university. One of the rare examples of 19th century American architecture in Istanbul, this wooden building has hosted many important people throughout its history. In 1917, Queen Maria of Romania and in 1932 the Queen of Yugoslavia were hosted in the building, which was later donated to the university by the family in memory of David Alexander Scott, who lost his life in World War II.

The museum is a valuable source of information and documents that shed light on the history of Robert College and Boğaziçi University. The core of the collection consists of furniture, documents and books donated by the Scott family. Also on display inside are furniture from the early 20th century, various ceramic plates, and works of art such as Japanese ceramics with Chinese figures. Researchers can utilise the documents, books, videos and tapes in the museum to gain a detailed insight into the cultural heritage of the university and its surroundings. Visitors have the opportunity to explore the university's past and see a rich collection of historical artefacts in this unique space.

Earthquake Resistant Cities Exhibition by Boğaziçi University

'Earthquake Resistant Cities of Tomorrow' exhibition, prepared under the leadership of Boğaziçi University Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute (KRDAE) Earthquake Engineering Department, met with visitors hosted by Salt Beyoğlu. The 'Earthquake Resistant Cities of Tomorrow' exhibition, the project management of which was undertaken by Prof. Dr. Eser Çaktı and Dr. Emin Yahya Menteşe, faculty members of Boğaziçi University Department of Earthquake Engineering, and the coordination of which belongs to Emine Öner, was realised in cooperation with Pattu Architecture. The exhibition, organised within the scope of the 'Cities of Tomorrow' project supported by the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF) of the United Kingdom Research and Innovation (UKRI) unit, examined the earthquake phenomenon after the earthquakes of 6 February 2023 from angles that will shed light on the scientific background of the earthquake phenomenon, and addressed the principles of urban design and planning of tomorrow from a social, structural, institutional and spatial perspective.



The Rare Works collection of Boğaziçi University Library includes Islamic manuscripts and works printed in various Ottoman printing presses, as well as many different types of Western works, the oldest of which dates back 500 years. Some of the books stand out with their artistic bindings, some with their special printing techniques, and some with their signatures, notes and ex-libris. With the exhibition, where criteria such as printing types, artistic designs, visual diversity and reflecting the history of the University are taken into consideration in the selection of samples, it is aimed to introduce the ex-libris art, which is an important art branch, and the ex-libris works that stand out in the collection.



The Centre offers a wide range of opportunities to students with its 61-seat Cinema Hall, Film Viewing Room, which offers the opportunity to watch individual films, Cinephile Room, which is used for cinema conversations and research, and Archive Room, which houses one of Turkey's most important film archives.

In addition, in the Natuk Birkan Building on the South Campus, there is an Editing Room where films can be edited and an office where Altyazı Monthly Cinema Magazine, published by the Centre, is prepared. The Centre provides students with film-related events and resources, creating a unique learning and sharing space for film enthusiasts.

In addition to being the only public institution cinema in Turkey, SineBU is also the first cinema hall with an infrastructure suitable for access by disabled individuals. With its design suitable for the participation of individuals with orthopedic disabilities and its audio description infrastructure, it aims to enable individuals with visual and hearing problems to have an equal, independent and free cinema experience. 

Rare Works and Historical Archives

The archive collections within the Boğaziçi University Library Rare Works and Historical Archives Branch Directorate include institutional archive and private collection materials donated to Boğaziçi University or acquired by the university.

The rare artefacts collection contains approximately 30 thousand artefacts in different genres from the 16th to the 20th century. The collection is based on the library of Robert College. Cyrus Hamlin, the founder and first principal of Robert College, mentions in his memoirs that Harvard University Law School donated 200 valuable books on the occasion of the establishment of the College. These donations and other books collected at that time were the first works that formed the basis of the Robert College library. The library collection was enriched over time and became one of the most important libraries of the period.

The archive collections include documents, letters, handwritten notes, photographs, postcards, newspaper and magazine clippings, published articles, awards and some objects belonging to important people. Some of the collections were classified and digitised within the scope of the project titled 'History of Science, Culture and Education in Istanbul through Personal Archives'. BULive, developed by Boğaziçi University, is an online virtual meeting and distance education tool that enables users in different locations to communicate. This BigBlueButton based platform is a free and open source web conferencing software. Developed with Ruby and JavaScript and running platform independent thanks to its HTML5 based interface, this application offers many features such as creating classes and groups, interaction via whiteboard, screen and file sharing, external video viewing, chat, hand raising, survey and note sharing, video/lecture recording.



Affordable Housing Policy for Employees

Boğaziçi University provides affordable housing facilities to meet the housing needs of its employees and to raise their living standards. Accessible for both academic and administrative staff, these residences can be rented at reasonable prices and offer an affordable solution for employees' budgets.

Housing Allocation Process

Housing allocation is made according to a scoring system determined by the Housing Allocation Commission. In the scoring process, criteria such as the academic and administrative responsibilities of the applicant, the projects carried out, the workload and the size of the requested housing are taken into account. The duration of use of the residences is limited to 5 years, and during this period, employees have the opportunity to have comfortable and affordable accommodation with their families.

Boğaziçi University offers affordable and comfortable accommodation options to meet the accommodation needs of its students and to raise their living standards. Dormitories located on different campuses provide students with a safe, peaceful and affordable living environment.

Dormitory Facilities

Dormitories are located in South, North, Kandilli, Anadolu Hisarı and Kilyos Sarıtepe campuses and consist of 7 buildings in total. Dormitories have facilities such as laundry, prayer rooms, study halls, wired and wireless internet, 24-hour hot water. In addition, all dormitories have counselling staff working on a 24-hour shift system.

Our dormitories have 2 room layouts.

These are;

Room Type Dormitories: Hamlin Hall Dormitory, Theodorus Hall Dormitory and Anadolu Hisarı Dormitory are room type dormitories. In these dormitories, residence areas are organised as rooms. Dormitories have facilities such as wireless internet, 24-hour hot water, wooden furniture, bunk beds, wardrobes, tables, chairs, bookcases and refrigerators. Bathrooms and toilets are located on the floors and are shared by students.

Apartment Type Dormitories: 3rd Kilyos Dormitory, 3rd North Dormitory, 4th North Dormitory and Kandilli Dormitory are apartment type dormitories. The apartments are equipped with wireless internet, 24-hour hot water, wooden furniture, bunk beds, wardrobes, tables, chairs, bookcases and refrigerators. There are orthopaedic rooms in apartment-type dormitories for disabled students.



Affordable Accommodation for Students

Boğaziçi University Dormitories are managed and supervised in accordance with the provisions of the Ministry of Youth and Sports Regulation on Higher Education Private Accommodation Services and Boğaziçi University Student Dormitories Directive.

Fees and Scholarships

Dormitory fees are updated every year by keeping them at reasonable levels. The university provides dormitory scholarships through the scholarship office for students with insufficient economic status. These scholarships, which are offered to students who meet the specified criteria, contribute to equal opportunities for all students by covering the cost of accommodation. The dormitory scholarship is valid for students who have the right to stay in the dormitory and continue to meet the scholarship criteria as long as they do not interrupt their education, and is provided for 9 months (between September and May) during each academic year.


Protection of Natural and Man-made Elements in Harmony

In particular, the existing plant texture has been carefully preserved to protect the sub-forest plant species and maintain the ecological balance.


Updating Probable Earthquake Loss Estimates for Istanbul Province

Within the scope of the protocol agreement titled 'Updating Probable Earthquake Loss Estimates for Istanbul' signed between Boğaziçi University and Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality, current population, building and infrastructure inventories of Istanbul have been created and urban scale earthquake risk assessment studies have been completed using current earthquake ground motion data/models.

Co-operation with Local Authorities on Planning and Development

The studies were carried out by the Department of Earthquake Engineering, Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute in cooperation with the Department of Earthquake Risk Management and Urban Improvement, Earthquake and Soil Investigation Directorate. In the project, earthquake hazard analyses, risk analyses of urban superstructure and infrastructure elements and earthquake risk assessment of Yenikapı and Maltepe rally areas were carried out. While urban earthquake hazard and risk analyses were handled by deterministic and probabilistic methods, various vibration measurement and modelling approaches were used in the earthquake risk assessment of rally areas, liquefaction potential and anchorage stability analyses were performed.

Cities of Tomorrow Project

Boğaziçi University Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute Earthquake Engineering Department has been selected as the management and coordination centre of the Istanbul leg of the Tomorrow's Cities project, which is supported by UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) and managed by the University of Edinburgh. Within the scope of this five-year international project, it is planned to establish an Istanbul City Office within the Department of Earthquake Engineering.

Tomorrow's Cities, which is carried out in line with the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations, aims to facilitate the transition from crisis management to planning and decision-making mechanisms that take into account multiple disaster risks in middle-income and low-income countries. The project aims to develop solutions for the construction of disaster-resilient cities by providing an international and interdisciplinary cooperation platform.

Under the title of "Istanbul of Tomorrow ", the project aims to transform Istanbul into a city resilient to multiple disaster risks and to protect disadvantaged groups from potential disasters. In this direction, it is aimed to establish a large-scale cooperation platform with the participation of non-governmental organisations, municipalities, universities and professional chambers.

Drainage by Design: Optimising Stormwater Infrastructure in Istanbul

Drainage by Design: Optimising Stormwater Infrastructure in Istanbul project, carried out in cooperation with Boğaziçi University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), offers a "Scientific Modelling Solution" to Istanbul's flood and infrastructure capacity problem. Within the scope of the project, it is planned to evaluate current and estimated precipitation data; acquisition of satellite data and determination of average and extreme precipitation amounts with ground-based transmitters (stations).

During the restoration process, environmentally friendly materials were preferred, technologies that increase energy efficiency were applied and the building was brought back to life as a green building in harmony with the natural and historical texture of the campus.

Building Construction in Compliance with Sustainable Standards

National Earthquake Monitoring Centre (UDIM)

The National Earthquake Monitoring Centre (UDIM), affiliated to Boğaziçi University Kandilli Observatory and Earthquake Research Institute, was awarded the LEED Gold Certificate in February 2015 as the first green building built from scratch and became the second green building of the university. Designed with the goals of energy efficiency, environmental sustainability and low carbon footprint, UDIM Building makes a significant contribution to sustainability by consuming 39.12% less energy than standard energy consumption rates.

Building Construction in Compliance with Sustainable Standards

Tarsus Archaeology Architecture History and Cultural Heritage Centre & Kandilli Dormitory

Following Hamlin Hall and UDIM buildings, the restoration of the Tarsus Archaeology Architectural History and Cultural Heritage Centre was completed in March 2016 and the building was awarded LEED Gold Certification. In April 2018, Kandilli Campus Student Dormitory was awarded the LEED Silver Certificate after its construction was completed.



These projects strongly demonstrate Boğaziçi University's commitment to sustainable building construction and restoration and clearly emphasise the importance it attaches to environmentally friendly building standards.

Boğaziçi University prioritises restoration projects in abandoned industrial zones and industrial areas in order to support environmental sustainability and protect cultural heritage. This approach contributes significantly to the preservation of historically important, idle industrial buildings and the re-functioning of these areas in accordance with modern needs.

From Abandoned Factory to Research Centre: Gözlükule Excavations Research Centre

One of the most striking examples of Boğaziçi University's vision to transform abandoned industrial areas into modern uses is the Tarsus Ginning Factory in Tarsus, Mersin. Founded in 1865, the factory served as one of the first industrial buildings for cotton production in the Çukurova Region. The factory, which was active until the 1980s, was abandoned after it lost its function and was used as a warehouse for a while. In 2000, it was expropriated by the Ministry of Culture and registered as industrial heritage.

Construction on Brownfield

Boğaziçi University took over 5 hangars of this historic factory and re-functionalised them as Gözlükule Excavation Work Office and Artifact Storages. During the restoration process, the cultural and historical values of the building were preserved and environmental sustainability principles were observed. These efforts have not only preserved the historic building, but also enabled the creation of a research centre that meets modern needs.



Awarded in 2019 by Europa Nostra in the Conservation Branch, this project demonstrates the success and sustainability approach of Boğaziçi University in transforming abandoned industrial buildings with respect for cultural heritage.

Student Housing Guarantee for Newly Enrolled Students

To ensure that newly enrolled students do not face housing insecurity, Boğaziçi University provides a one-year guaranteed on-campus accommodation for all students coming from outside Istanbul or distant districts, regardless of their socio-economic background. Moreover, those who rank within the top 1,000 nationwide in the university entrance exam are granted guaranteed housing in university dormitories for the entire duration of their studies.

This initiative offers a model for recording and safeguarding the intellectual heritage of modern literature, while strategically sustaining local literary, linguistic, and intellectual traditions for future generations.

Boğaziçi Lectures on the History of Astronomy and Islamic Scientific Heritage

As part of its Boğaziçi Lectures series, Boğaziçi University hosted world-renowned historian of science Prof. Dr. F. Jamil Ragep on 15 November 2024, providing an important academic forum for documenting and transmitting the rich legacy of Islamic astronomy and early scientific knowledge. Held at the Rectorate Conference Hall, the lecture explored the historical evolution of humanity's understanding of the cosmos—from Ancient Greek thought to Islamic philosophers and pre-modern Europe.

Prof. Dr. Ragep highlighted the pioneering contributions of Islamic scholars to the study of the universe, presenting striking examples such as the sophisticated astronomical instruments developed in Istanbul, Samarkand, Azerbaijan, and Delhi, and al-Biruni's calculation of the Earth's circumference at 39,700 kilometers, which aligns almost perfectly with modern measurements. He further emphasized how Qur'anic verses concerning the universe and the heavens inspired Islamic philosophers toward deeper scientific observation and inquiry.

This gathering showcased Boğaziçi University's vital role in preserving and transmitting the history of astronomy and the intellectual heritage of Islamic science, reinforcing its commitment to safeguarding and advancing universal scientific and cultural legacies.

Preserving Cultural Heritage through the Restoration of the 112-Year-Old Norman & Beard Organ

In line with its mission to safeguard and transmit cultural heritage to future generations, Boğaziçi University has meticulously restored the historic Norman & Beard organ, originally donated to the university in 1913. As one of the rare three-manual pipe organs housed within an institution in Türkiye, this exceptional instrument was brought back to life through an eight-month, university-led restoration project, culminating in a special concert titled "Celebration of Sounds." The recital, held at Albert Long Hall on the university's South Campus and featuring internationally acclaimed organ virtuoso Jacob Benda performing works by J.S. Bach, Saint-Saëns, and Widor, marked the organ's triumphant return to artistic life.

During the restoration process, the organ's wind system, pipes, swell and choir chambers, and both electrical and pneumatic mechanisms were carefully examined and refurbished, while intonation, tuning adjustments, and aesthetic refinements were completed with precision. Boğaziçi University Rector Prof. Dr. Mehmet Naci İnci emphasized that this project represents a vital cultural heritage initiative that carries the knowledge and aesthetic values of the past into the future, extending his gratitude to the academics, artists, and restoration team whose expertise and dedication made this revival possible.


Preserving and Transmitting Cultural Heritage through the Institute of Film and Media Studies

Boğaziçi University has taken an innovative step to safeguard and transmit cinematic and media culture to future generations at both academic and societal levels. Established in 2024, the Institute of Film and Media Studies is the first institute within a Turkish public university to offer English-language graduate programs and a Film Studies Certificate Program, providing in-depth, historically and theoretically grounded, and production-oriented education in film history, film theory, new media arts, digital culture, and sound studies.

Beyond its curriculum, the institute contributes to preserving and documenting Turkey's audiovisual heritage through monthly thematic film screenings at the historic Mithat Alam Hall, which bring together canonical works of film history and contemporary cinematic expressions. These activities represent a sustainable cultural heritage initiative, aiming to protect the collective memory of cinema, foster critical engagement with film and media culture among new generations, and document the evolving dialogue between local and global screen cultures.
